What should you expect in high school?

- More extracurricular activities
- More independence and more RESPONSIBILITY!
- Greater emphasis on academic achievement
- Greater consequences for failing classes
- Greater need for <u>time management</u> and <u>organization</u>

Freshmen and Sophomore Years

- Keep Grades Up
- Strength of Schedule
- ► Visit Colleges When Possible
- ► Discuss College with Students
- Prep for the SAT and ACT
- Service Hours and Extracurriculars!

SAT

- ► The SAT has the following sections:
 - -Evidenced-Based Reading & Writing
 - -Math
- No penalty for guessing
- ► Total composite score of 1600
- No Florida State school is requiring the essay portion. Out of state or Private colleges may require it.
- ► Cost- \$45

\$57 with Essay

ACT

- ▶ The ACT has the following sections:

 - -English -Math -Reading -Science
- ► The Writing portion is optional. No Florida State school is requiring it, but may be required at Private or Out of State Colleges
- ► Total Composite = 36 (average of all 4)
- ▶ There is no penalty for guessing.
- Cost: \$42.50 \$58.50 w/Essay

College Search

Conduct College Searches (Naviance, Collegeboard.org, etc.)

What Is Important to the Student?

- Location?
- Two year school vs. Four year school
- Do they have the major that he/she is interested in?
- ▶ Do they have the sport/extracurricular activity that he/she is interested in?
- Private vs. Public

Division I & II NCAA Eligibility (For current freshmen and sophomores)

Division 1 requirements:

- Complete 16 core courses
- ▶ Minimum *core* GPA of 2.30
- Meet sliding scale for test scores

Division 2 requirements:

- Complete 16 core courses
- ▶ Minimum *core* GPA of 2.20
- Meet sliding scale for test scores

NCAA Eligibility Center

- If your student is interested in playing a sport for a Division 1 or 2 school, they need to register with the NCAA Eligibility Center during their <u>Junior year</u>.
- At the end of the junior year, we will send out a transcript to the NCAA.
- When the student registers and takes the SAT/ACT have scores sent to the Eligibility Center using code 9999. If you send them when they register, it is free. If you send them after the test, there is a cost.
- If your child has attended any high school other than TC, you need them to send an official transcript from that high school. TC cannot do this for you.

Junior Year

- ► Keep Grades Up Trying to bring up your grades to improve your GPA during your Senior year is TOO LATE!
- ▶ Visit Colleges When Possible
- ► Attend Open Houses at Colleges
- Discuss College with Students
- Take the ACT and SAT
- ► Keep track of Usernames/Passwords
 - Be sure to use professional email address

Senior Year

- Strength of Schedule is still important!
- Start Applications Early
 - ► If the student is planning on attending a four year school, then they should have an idea of where they are applying to before they leave for the summer after junior year. They should be looking at apps over the summer and getting ahead.
 - Continue to Visit Schools and Attend College Fairs
 - Keep Grades Up even second semester!! Colleges can revoke acceptances on dropped classes or lower grades.
 - Make sure to get service hours!
 - Retake ACT and/or SAT if necessary
