AP Music Theory

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This is due the first day of school-it will be graded and you will be tested on it.

You must be able to read music in all four clefs – treble, alto, tenor and bass clef, and be extremely familiar with the piano keyboard. You will need to have all of your major and minor key signatures memorized. You need to be able to read music well in order to begin the course – I will not teach you that during the class.

Exercises –

Note Identification – Create your own exercise with the appropriate clef and range. Practice reading treble clef, alto clef, tenor clef, and bass clef. See attached paper for help with alto and tenor clef. You can change the clef in this trainer by clicking “settings”. Enable and practice each clef INDIVIDUALLY – 200 two separate times (and print), and then enable them all and practice it 3 times, 150 questions each. You must turn these papers in the first day of school – printer problems are not an excuse. If you choose to save a screenshot, please send them all in one email.

Keyboard Reverse Identification – Become familiar with the piano keyboard. You must know the names of the white and black keys and be able to locate them quickly on the piano. You must print this one as well- two separate papers, 250 questions each.

Key Signatures – Learn your major and your minor key signatures. Majors will come up automatically, to learn your minors, click on “minor mode” in settings.

Intervals – Extra Credit. If you REALLY want to succeed and get ahead, work on Interval Ear Training. Work on Intervals Ascending, then Descending, then both. If you’re already good at that, you can move on to Scale and Chord ear training. You’ll be a rock star. Print out every exercise of these you complete with above an 85%, and you’ll get extra credit points to use.

TeamApp – Request access to TCHS Band TeamApp, then the Access Group “AP Music Theory.”

This is ALL due on the first day of class. Be prepared to take a timed test on ALL of these things (except extra credit) the first day of school. If this assignment is not completed on time, and you are not able to pass the test, the instructor may recommend you for removal from the course.
