Founded in 2000, Trinity Catholic High School is the northern-most of 5 high schools in the Diocese of Orlando. Trinity Catholic, located in Ocala, Florida, serves an average of 475 students enrolled in grades 9-12 from 6 contiguous counties. TC partners with the College of Central Florida, as well as Embry-Riddle Aeronautical/Barry/& Saint Leo Universities for dual enrollment opportunities.

FACULTY

Trinity Catholic High School has a professional staff of 41 men and women, 54% of which hold advanced degrees. The average teaching experience of the faculty is 15.4 years.

GRADE INFORMATION

All students take seven courses each year. Cumulative grade point averages are based on annual grades. The annual grade is computed by combining quarter grades with semester exams.

Grade point average is weighted. Honors, Advanced Placement, and Dual Enrollment courses receive an additional weight.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT / DUAL ENROLLMENT

These classes provide an additional challenge to those students who possess a high level of responsibility, are capable of independent work, and exhibit highly-developed thinking skills. Any student taking an advanced placement course must take the AP exam in May. TCHS uses a 0.0 to 5.0 weighted cumulative GPA Scale. The difference in these course offerings is not necessarily content, although some adjustments are made in the reading level of the textbooks used. The primary difference is the pace at which material is presented. Most courses are college preparatory.

CURRICULUM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Trinity Catholic High School offers an expanded college preparatory curriculum designed to meet the needs of all types of learners. The four levels of courses offered: College Preparatory, Honors, Advanced Placement, and Dual Enrollment are designed to challenge students academically and prepare them for admission to college. Twenty-eight credits are required for graduation in the following subject areas:
