Letter from the President



During the 2021-22 school year, Trinity Catholic underwent review and received accreditation from the Florida Catholic Conference and Cognia. Our review team commented, "Trinity Catholic is a giving, caring community proud of its students and school." Our students' academic, spiritual, and physical achievements are displayed for the glory of God, attracting the spiritual, educational, and financial support necessary for continued growth.

Due to a successful Celtic Institute of the Arts, the Albert & Elizabeth Colangelo Fine Arts Center is under development on campus. We are well underway with the "Reflecting God's Glory Together" campaign to raise five million dollars and build a state-of-the-art facility to benefit our student body and the community. This center will add another dimension to our beautiful campus serving Campus Ministry, visual and performing arts, and multimedia programs, as well as drawing in visitors for performances, gallery shows, and other events. I encourage you to prayerfully consider committing to this campaign.

We are also very blessed by your support of the annual Jeans and Jerseys Tailgate Party held in the fall. Last year's event set records for money raised for tuition assistance and extracurricular activities. Thanks to Mrs. Judy Dunlap for funding the brand new all-digital scoreboard at Dunlap Track and Field. This scoreboard will enhance the game experiences in Celtic Stadium.

Other improvements on our campus include a new softball scoreboard, a digital message board that replaces the sign on the NW corner of the campus, and a newly renovated Boys Basketball locker room. Additional improvements in the planning stages will keep our campus in the spotlight and provide our students with the necessary tools to excel.

One hundred percent of our 113 class of 2022 graduates matriculated from Trinity Catholic to colleges and universities or entered military service. The class earned over fourteen million in scholarship money and received accolades for their academic and extracurricular successes and the quantity and quality of Christian service they performed at TCHS.

We owe a debt of gratitude to our faculty, staff, and administration joyfully fulfilling their roles at Trinity Catholic so students can benefit from this tremendous opportunity. I remain humbled and awed by the generosity of the Trinity Catholic community for the vast blessings you provide for this school. As I enter my ninth year here, I look forward to walking and growing with all of you on our journey to provide students the opportunity to deepen their relationship with God, excel academically, and commit to a life of service to others.

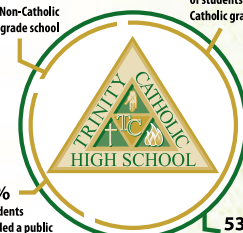

Class of 2022 - With most of the COVID-19 restrictions lifted, this class was able to enjoy many of the events that the two previous classes were not able to have. The student population grew this past year, including the size of the senior class, with new/transfer students. Their accomplishments in the classroom, on the field, and in other extracurricular activities earned this class over \$15 million in scholarships, and they received acceptance to institutions such as the University of Pennsylvania, University of Notre Dame, Catholic University, School of the Art Institute of Chicago, University of Florida, and Florida State University.

This class also deepened their belief in the importance of their faith. Chris Heard was baptized and confirmed as a Catholic at the 2022 Easter Vigil.

Alumni Spotlight - Brittany Bowe

This winter, the eyes of the world were on the city of Ocala as three speedskaters competed in the 2022 Winter Olympics in Beijing. This is not a typo; three Olympic athletes from Ocala, Florida were competing in the winter games at an ice rink. There are no ice rinks in Ocala!

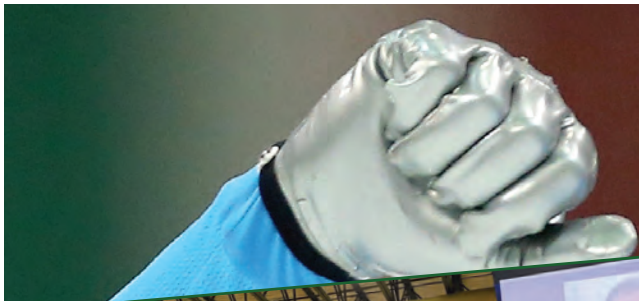
One of those athletes is a Trinity Catholic High School graduate, Brittany Bowe (class of 2006). This was not the first time Brittany competed in the games; she won the Team Pursuit bronze medal 4 years prior at Pyeongchang and also participated in the 2014 Sochi Winter Olympic games.

In 2022 she won a bronze medal as an individual long track speedskater in the 1000-meter race. However, this was not her biggest moment. At the US Olympic trials, Brittany qualified for another event, the 500-meter speedskating race.

Her fellow teammate and friend from Ocala, Erin Jackson, favored to win gold in this event at the Olympics, did not qualify. Erin slipped during the trials. This did not feel right to Brittany and in a selfless act, she gave up her spot to Erin, who went on to win the gold medal and break a world record. Erin is the first black woman to medal in speedskating.

Brittany visited Trinity Catholic and spoke with our student body in March 2022. She cited her experience as a high school student at TC as being crucial to her faith foundation. During her visit, to honor Bowe's integrity on the world stage, TC president Lou Pereira and Athletic Director Tommy Bond announced the replacement of the Sportsmanship Award with the Brittany Bowe Character in Athletics Award. This award is given to a graduating senior on Senior Awards night. Brittany, we thank you for impacting your alma mater in such a meaningful way.





Fine Arts

All Trinity Catholic students are required to take two semesters in the arts. They are offered a wide variety of choices ranging from ceramics to AP music theory to guitar. The Celtic Institute of the Arts is an arts honors program that allows students to take multiple electives like band, choir and art classes simultaneously. The CIA is designed to help students excel in the Fine Arts, develop their creativity and foster a life-long love of the arts. Two honor societies, Tri-M Music Honor Society and National Art Honor Society offers students the means to receive recognition for exceptional music/artwork, academics, leadership, service and character.

Performing Arts Our music department offers a myriad of courses for both vocalists and instrumentalists.

Choir - This year's highlights:

- Biggest choir in TCHS history with 63 students, up from 25 four years ago
- Largest number of All-State choir students in school history with seven students accepted to honor choirs – 1 in men's choir, 2 in women's choir, 3 in concert choir, and 1 in the reading choir – **the most from any school in Marion County**
- 16 choir members participated in All-County Choir.
- First time taking 4 choirs to district MPA and 2 to state MPA
- **Men's Choir received Straight Superiors at the State Level Music Performance Assessment.**
- First successful trip with members of this group traveling to Nashville, Tennessee, where we had the opportunity to record in RCA Studio B and sing at the Grand Ole Opry

Band - This year's highlights:

- The **Trinity Catholic Celtic Pride Marching Band** scored a **Straight Superior (Highest) Rating at the 2021 Florida Bandmasters Association District 19 Marching and Music Performance Assessment.**
- **Honor Bands:** Students audition and are selected for Honor Bands.
 - All-District Band: 15 students
 - Festival of Winds at USF: 5 students
 - Tri-State Band Festival & Conducting Conference at FSU: 1 student
 - All-State Honor Band at the Florida Music Educators Association State Convention: 2 students.
 - All-County Honor Band: 16 students
- 9 of our music students represented the Tri-M Music Honor Society at FMEA in January.

Six of our music (Choir and Band) students were accepted into music programs at the University of Florida and Florida State University with majors in music education, performance, and music therapy.



Visual Arts

The Trinity Catholic Visual Arts Department had a successful year of awards and growth. Students placed 2nd and 4th and honorable mention at the Fine Arts Festival of Ocala and 1st place at the City of Ocala Emerging and Student Art Exhibition. Students participated in county, state, and national-level art exhibits and competitions.

Students explored digital art and design, drawing, painting, printmaking, ceramics, and three-dimensional sculpture. Students learned how to apply the elements of art and principles of design to create unique works of art. They will continue their visual arts journey through creative photography, ceramics, AP Studio art, and 2D studio art.

The class of '22 seniors gained acceptance to art schools such as Ringling College of Art and Design, Savannah College of Art and Design, and School of the Art Institute of Chicago.



Ministry - Leading to an Encounter with Christ

As part of the mission of Trinity Catholic High, our students are given the opportunity to deepen their relationship with God. Our Dean of Faith Formation and Campus Ministry, Liz Cook, developed activities all year long to help enrich our students in the teaching of Jesus.

Peer Ministry: A group of about 40 students committed to serving the community of TC and developing their Christian leadership skills.

Peer Ministry activities: Facilitating prayer activities on campus such as Mass, seasonal events, Community Service Fair, Penance services, Stations of the Cross, Rosary, etc. Also helping with off-campus events like retreats for TC and retreats for our middle school feeder programs.

Service Projects: Dress-down days, nursing home visits, helping with New Student Orientation/Celtic for a Day, Catholic Schools Week

Year highlights:

TC is the only Catholic high school in our diocese that has 2 weekly Masses: one optional before school and one during the school day for the entire school. Due to COVID, weekly Mass included two grade levels to ensure social distancing.

This year's spiritual theme for the Diocese was, "Imago Dei: Made in the Image of God." Throughout the year TC strived to foster a spirit of encounter with one another through retreats, prayer, and acts of service in order to see Christ in themselves and others.

- Weekly Mass with all grade levels.
- Reconciliation monthly with First Friday Adoration and chapel time
- We had 2 retreats for each grade level, including some fun get-away retreats for Juniors and Seniors.
- Commissioned about 15 new high school Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion that will serve the Body and Blood of Christ to our TC community.
- The Seniors hosted a "Feeding the 5000" food drive and collected food to donate to Brother's Keeper.
- Started a "You've been Blessed" prayer chain in the homerooms to encourage intercessory prayer.
- With the help of the Cooking Club, started a "pie bake-off" competition fundraiser to raise \$300 for the Arnette House, an emergency shelter for teens.
- During Catholic Schools Week, students made over 300 blessing bags and over 500 meat and cheese and PB&J sandwiches, along with participating in 13 other service projects.
- Had a joint Peer Ministry retreat with Santa Fe Catholic High School.
- Had students participate in lectoring, ushering, and singing at the Diocesan Chrism Mass, one of the most special Masses of the year!
- Displayed an outdoor Live Stations of the Cross that involved over 50 students and faculty and the entire school prayed the stations together.
- Recorded over 24,000 service hours for the '21-'22 school year.
- And one student received his sacraments of initiation and is now a part of the Catholic Church!

Boys Basketball New Locker Room:

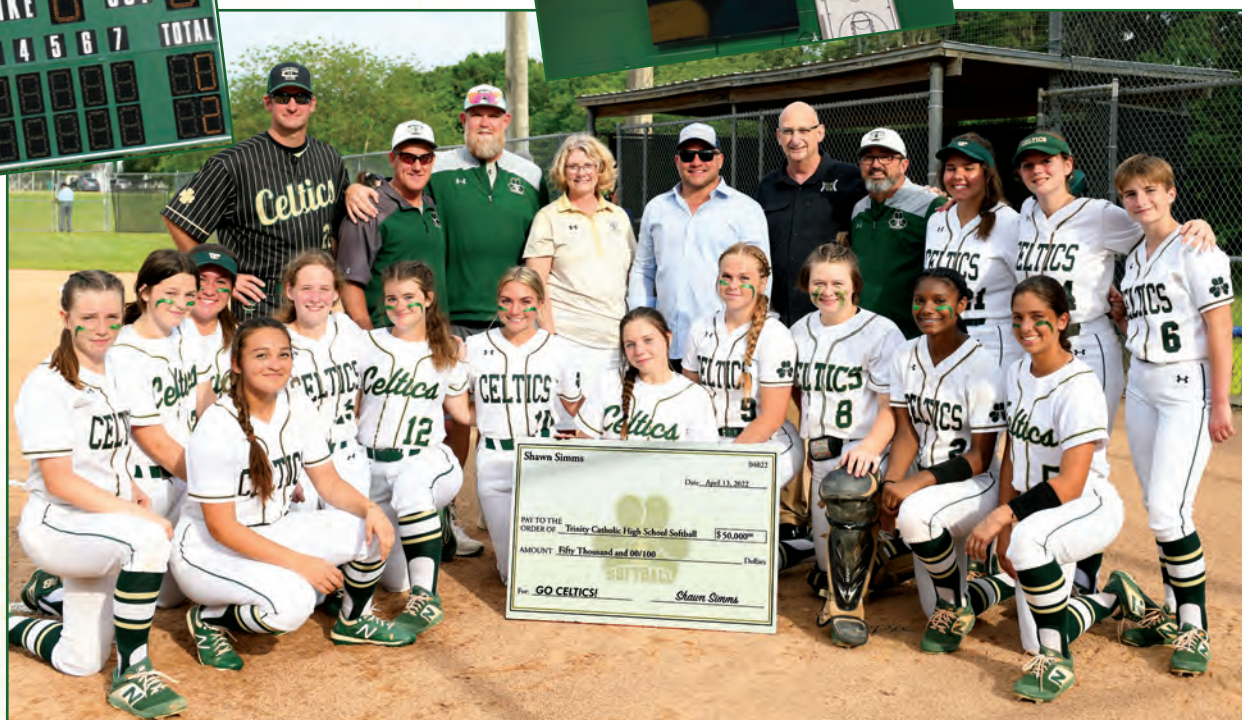

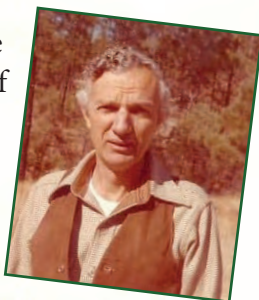

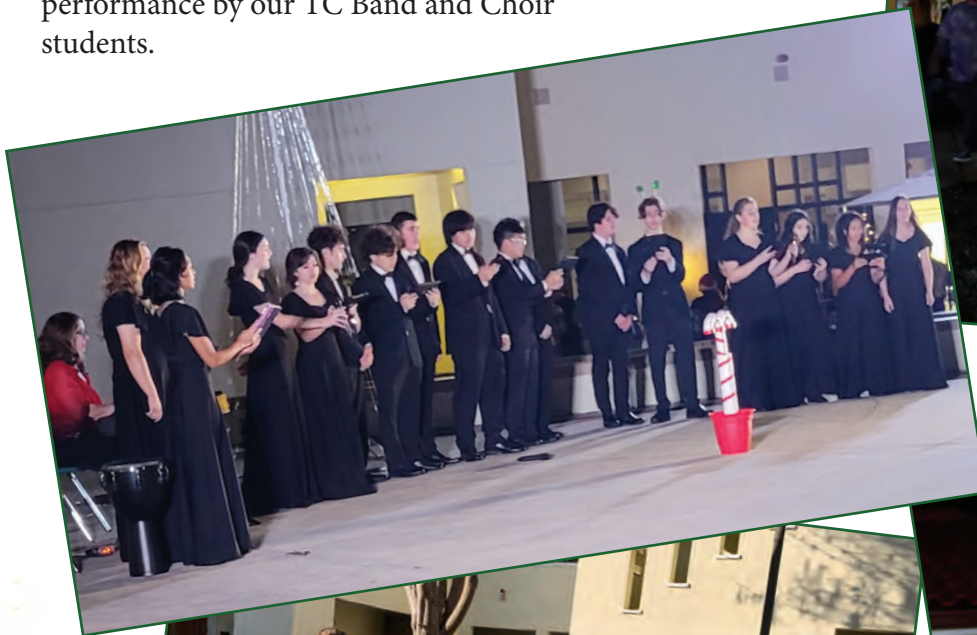
Christmas At TC

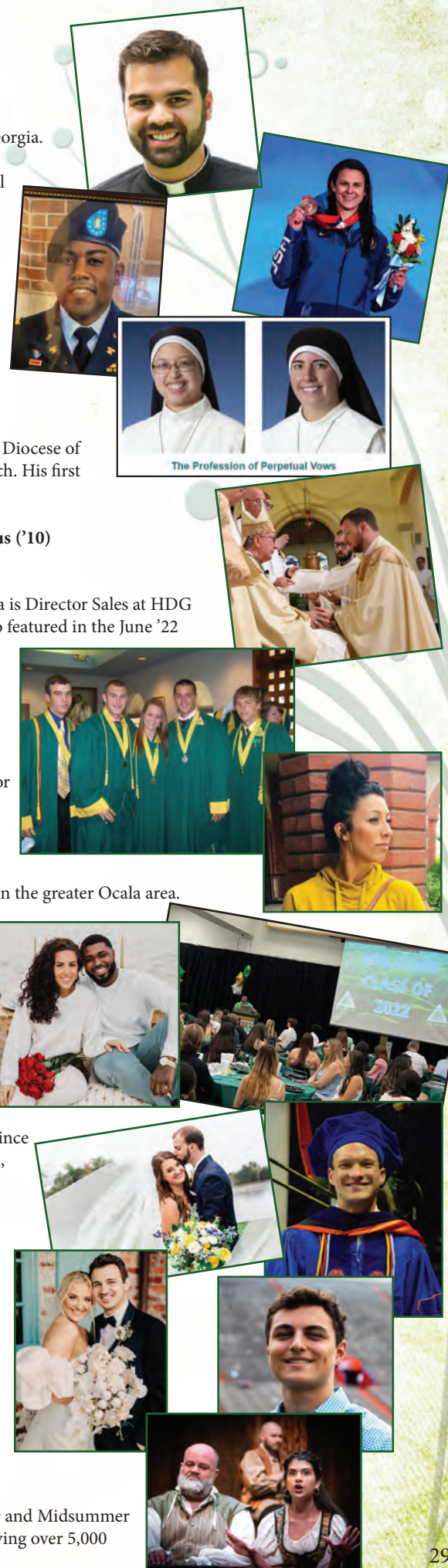

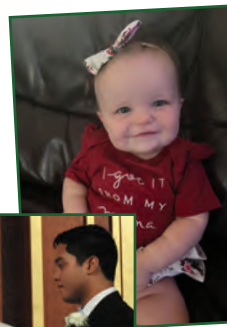
