Lou's Letter

Trinity Catholic's 2022-23 school year was quite memorable. The class of '23 did not disappoint as a fine group of seniors. They had accolades in the classroom, through competition, and through the many ways they served one another as Celtics. The spirit of Trinity was alive and well with this group of graduates.

The 2022-23 year saw many changes at TCHS. Through the efforts of the "TC FFA (Future Farmers of America) Alumni & Supporters", the Immaculata Barn was constructed on our campus to serve our agricultural science program. This group is comprised of parents connected to TCHS through a student who attends, plus other adults who benefited by being a part of FFA during their high school years and want to pass that on to our young people. Immaculata Barn and Outdoor Learning Center creates a place of focus for this program and our Agriscience Pathway curriculum.

In another area of campus, our softball complex received a much-needed facelift. Due to the efforts of many fine supporters, including Mr. Shawn Simms, Mr. Todd Duffy, and Ms. Kathy Dingle, the upgrades to the softball complex are striking. This year's improvements complement the scoreboard installed last school year and include a new backstop, new dugouts, additional storage, new fencing, and field improvements. This makes our facility a shining star in Marion County.

To complement our outstanding track and field, Mrs. Judy Dunlap provided a gift that made possible the addition of a new video scoreboard in our north endzone. This gift enabled us to enhance the game day experience for our fans in every sport that uses Dunlap Track and Field. We are grateful for Mrs. Dunlap's continued, unwavering support.

An additional accomplishment is the completion of our stained glass "project" in the Chapel. At various points throughout this school year, Sister Diane Couture of St. Joseph Ministries' Architectural Stained Glass Studio installed stained glass over each of the three large windows behind the altar. Altogether, the artwork for these windows represents the Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We thank the family of Mr. Richard Pesola for their sponsorship of this last phase of our stained glass endeavor.

Trinity Catholic brought back the Palm for Education Car Raffle, and the good people at Palm Chevrolet once again sponsored this effort which raises revenue for tuition assistance. This fundraiser was so well received that we topped the thirty-thousand-dollar goal set by Mr. Holcomb, our Advancement Director. This event, along with the ever-popular Jeans and Jerseys Tailgate Party, continues to provide funding that helps our school and its students thrive.

I have described just a few of the incredible things we've seen in the last year at Trinity Catholic. Our community has always given generously to this school. 

Alumni Spotlight - Tyler Stentiford, Class of 2012

Every morning at TC, the students recite the TC vision statement. The second line fits Tyler Stentiford, which is: A Trinity Catholic graduate will actively bring about the kingdom of God and will use his or her unique talents to spread love to others through good citizenship and service. When news broke that TC was in the planning stages of building a fine arts center, Tyler, a University of South Florida graduate who majored in Architectural and Theatrical Design, and his father, Paul Stentiford, set up a meeting with Lou Pereira about getting involved with the project.

Afterward, he supported TC's Building Committee by helping to determine this building's needs so that it could be a beacon in Marion County. During this time, he put together a small group of alumni and friends of TC to coordinate a fundraiser in support of the capital campaign. Music of the Mouse was born. This past summer, Tyler was named Vice President at Stentiford Construction.

What made Trinity Catholic so special to you?

Trinity was special to me because it was like attending school with a family. Many of us had known each other since we were literally in diapers and had grown up together and that kind of special bond with your classmates and peers is unique.

Were there any special programs or activities that made you choose the major you decided to pursue? I was very involved in music ministry while at TC. This led to work in theatrical design, which led me to study it in college.

Your faith has been an important part of your life. How did TC nurture your relationship with Christ?

Trinity allowed me to grow in my relationship with Christ through experiences like retreats, where my classmates and I reflected on our faith journey together.

What was one of your favorite moments at TC?

One of my favorite memories while at TC was getting to play piano for Mass. There was something special about our entire school family singing and worshipping together, and being a part of creating the music for each of these moments was very memorable for me.



When it was announced that TC was going to build a new fine arts center, you were one of the first who wanted to get involved. Why did you make that decision?


While I was at TC, I saw a faculty and staff willing to do anything for their students. Because of this attention and dedication to a student's success, I found a passion for piano and theatre that I may not have otherwise known. When I heard that TC was building a fine arts center, I wanted to be a part of that project in any way possible so that I could help give another student the opportunity I received.

You also spearheaded Music of the Mouse, one of the largest alumni functions that gave back to TC. How did that come about?

During some of the meetings for the Colangelo Fine Arts Center, we discussed budget options, fundraising, and ways to make our budget work to get to our goal. I wanted to help contribute to that and show the community what this kind of facility means to students, faculty, and alumni. After reaching out to some performers, we created a ten-piece ensemble with a full choir and vocalists comprised of Trinity Catholic alumni, students, family, and friends who wanted to help contribute to this fantastic cause. We created our musical revue, which would be entertaining for kids and adults, called Music of the Mouse.

Your parents are Founders of TC; they helped lay the foundation for building the school and what it is today. How does it feel sitting next to your dad on the Building Committee, knowing that you are now a part of developing the future of TC?

My parents are an enormous inspiration to me; they taught me that when God blesses you with something, you should always give something back. I always knew that I wanted to do something for the school that gave me so much during my time there, but getting to sit next to my dad on the committee that is helping shape this facility is better than anything I could have imagined. I am so happy that I get to be a part of a lasting change like this on an amazing campus, and I only hope that some other student walks into the Colangelo Fine Arts Center one day and picks up an instrument to discover that they have a God-given talent that they may have never even known about.



Ministry - Leading to an Encounter with Christ

Our Campus Ministry was very busy this school year as our Campus Minister, Liz Cook, and her peer ministers helped shape the school's Catholic identity with our students and the TC community. TC students recorded over 16,000 service hours over the past school year.

Trinity Catholic is the only high school in the Diocese that holds weekly Mass with all grades. A new class called, "Servant Leadership and Missionary Discipleship" was also formed, which helped our students gain a stronger voice in planning retreats and campus activities. These students also would go around to classes and pray with each class at the beginning of class time.

During Catholic Schools Week, students participated in a, "Together we CAN: ProLife Edition" collection, where students donated over three shopping carts full of supplies to the local Alpha Center For Women. This non-profit organization provides counseling, education, advocacy, and physical support to parents during and after pregnancy.

Trinity Catholic also hosted St. Luke Productions for a live, one-man theatrical presentation of, "Tolton: From Slave to Priest". This program shares the story of Venerable Augustus Tolton, America's first recognized African-American Catholic priest, charismatic preacher, and evangelizer.


Colangelo Fine Arts Center Opening Night
